## Recent Hunts Point Municipal Code Changes

<u>Fence Heights</u>	<u>Pet Licenses</u>
<p>Among the many changes brought about by the SR 520 construction was a regional bicycle trail very close to some resident's homes. The Council changed the Municipal Code to allow those residents whose property abuts the trail to have fences up to eight feet in height. All other properties remain at the six foot height maximum.</p>	<p>Our Municipal Code referred to King County as issuing pet licenses for residents of Hunts Point. However we do not have a contract with the County. We have changed the Code to reflect that the City of Medina will issue our pet licenses. It is a lifetime license. Go to Medina City Hall to receive a license for your pet.</p>

84th Avenue Northeast and SR 520 ramps closed • Access to Hunts Point via Northeast 28th Street • Access to SR 520 via 92nd Avenue Northeast and Bellevue Way
