Evergreen Point Road shifting to final location

Crews are hard at work getting Evergreen Point Road ready to open in its final location. Drivers should prepare for a four-day-long lane closure that could cause short delays as the new roadway is completed. This shift makes room for crews to complete lid-top landscaping this summer and the transit facility at the end of 2013.

Evergreen Point Road work highlights:

- April 27-30 roadway reduced to single lane
- April 30 roadway opens in new final location

Paving work is weather dependent, therefore all dates are estimated and subject to change.

How will crews complete the work?

Crews will reduce the road to a single lane, while crews pave the new lanes. Flaggers will alternate northbound and southbound traffic through the work zone.

The work will take about four days to complete and will include night work.

What can drivers expect?

Drivers should plan for short delays on Evergreen Point Road through the work zone. Pedestrian and bicycle access will be maintained while this work is completed.
