### Fireworks in Hunts Point

Town regulations permit residents to set off fireworks in connection with Independence Day celebrations, [subject to the following limitations](#):

1. Fireworks must be used at least 20 feet from any structure;
2. They must be kept at least 10 feet away from other combustible material;
3. They must be attended at all times by a competent, responsible person with access to either a hose connected to a water supply or to a fire extinguisher
4. Persons using fireworks are responsible for removal, repair and clean-up of all debris associated with their fireworks

Additionally, only “consumer fireworks” as defined by Washington Administrative Code § 212-17-025 are permitted for private use. All properly licensed fireworks retailers are required to have a listing of which fireworks meet the definition of “consumer fireworks” and should be able to assist you at purchase. Any professional fireworks and shows must be permitted through [Bellevue Fire](#).

Fireworks may be set off only between the following hours on the following days:

- June 29 – July 3, 9:00am – 11:00pm
- **July 4, 9:00am – Midnight**
- July 5, 9:00am – 11:00pm

Finally, please keep in mind that it is unlawful to use fireworks in a reckless manner that creates a substantial risk of death or serious injury to other persons or their property (RCW 70.77.488).

\* High-risk populations are currently defined by CDC as: persons 65 years of age and older; people of all ages with underlying medical conditions (particularly not well controlled), including people with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, people who have serious heart conditions, people who are immunocompromised, people with severe obesity, people with diabetes, people with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis, and people with liver disease, people who live in a nursing home or long-term care facility.
