

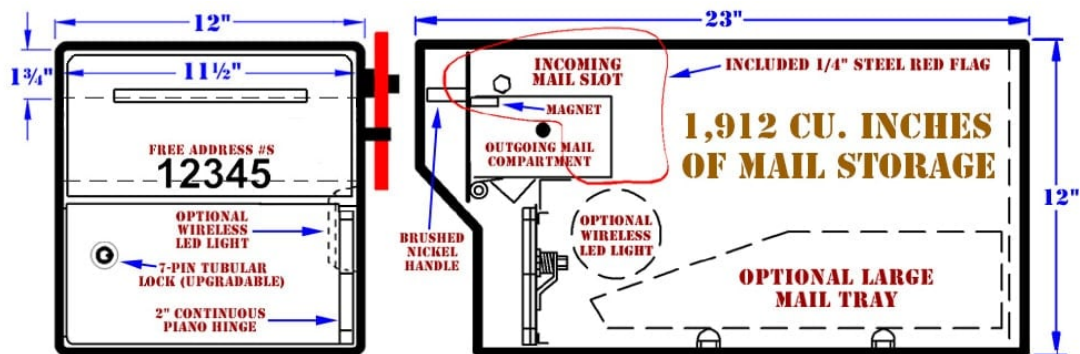

### New Mailbox Option

As many of our residents are unfortunately aware of mail theft has been on the increase over the past few years. Town staff researched for a new model of mailbox that would provide a greater level of security as well as fit into the Town's pagodas and decided on the [Fortress Fort Knox Mailbox](#).

The mailbox is constructed with a 1/4" thick steel shell, 3/16" thick reinforced steel and weights just under 100 lbs. It also has a 7 pin tubular lock which are often considered to be safer and more resistant to picking than standard locks. This level of security and craftsmanship does come at a significantly higher price point. ### Storm Season is Here

With the weather turning and winter approaching, the Town of Hunts Point will be working hard to keep roads clean, safe, and cleared in the coming months. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and Washington State's Safe Start plan, Town Hall remains closed at this time and some of our public works contractors may be more difficult to reach right away. However, Town staff continue to operate remotely and will be working to resolve any public works needs with our contractors and neighboring jurisdictions as soon as an issue arises.

If you witness a problem on public property such as a fallen tree or limbs, a hedge that restricts street visibility, fallen street signs, or clogged storm drains, please contact Town Hall at (425) 455-1834. Calls will be forwarded to the appropriate staff person and we will respond to messages as soon as possible. In the event of an emergency, please call 9-1-1.



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## Commercial Parking in Hunts Point

Commercial parking applies to all nonresidential parking including construction-related vehicles, landscape maintenance, plumbers, house cleaners, and any other agent with a commercial purpose. Except if otherwise stated, commercial parking is allowed along the town right-of-way immediately in front of the serviced residence between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and between 9.00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Saturday. Parking is not allowed on Sundays and legal holidays. If adequate parking in the right-of-way of the serviced residence is not available, it is the responsibility of the property owner to provide parking outside of the Town or elsewhere on the property. 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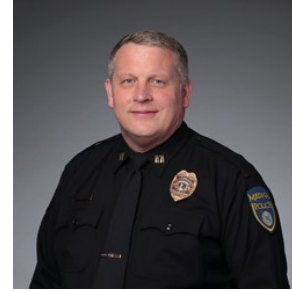
## Meet Your Medina Police

The Medina Police Department consists of nine commissioned police officers (chief, captain, sergeant, and six police officers) and two professional staff. The nine commissioned officers are Chief Steve Burns (pictured), Captain Dave Scherf (pictured), Sergeant Austin Gidlof, and Police Officers James Martin, Brady Halverson, Scott Eng, Eric Anderson, Conner Bell, and Tyler Glenn. The department is fortunate to have two professional staff – Records Office Manager Barbara Marxer and Police Administrative Specialist Sunita Hall - that among other things provide conceal pistol licenses, fingerprinting, emergency preparedness, and evidence management. Each employee has a strong commitment to providing a personal service to the community. Officers have over 130 years of combined law enforcement experience which includes time spent in Homeland Security, felony investigation units, academy instruction trainers, collision investigation, and field training officers.

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## Political Signs

With election season in full swing, the Town would like to remind residents about political campaign signs placed within the Town. The Hunts Point Municipal Code states “*signs relating to political, religious or community events or issues are allowed on private property provided:*”

- *Political signs must comply with all state statutes or regulations regulating campaign advertising as they may be enacted or amended from time to time*
- *Political signs relating to a particular election must be removed within 48 hours following such election*
- *The total square footage of all such signs shall not exceed four square feet per residence*
